

Banking management

The Banking Management specialization, part of the bachelor study program Banking Framework at the College of Banking, was first established during the academic year 1999/2000.

The course is aimed first of all at the theoretical preparation of students for work in finance and in other areas of economic processes management on the levels of enterprises and national economy. The course offers instruction in methods and processes which market agents and state authorities may use directly under current and potential future conditions.

The aim of the course and graduate profile

The aim of the Banking Management course is to prepare graduates of higher education, theoretically prepared and practically skilled for managerial positions in banking, the insurance industry, or any other similar position within the entire financial sphere. The graduate is also ready to take over financial management positions in private and public sector companies and institutions.

The Banking Manager course graduate has acquired the knowledge and skills needed for lower or medium banking management positions. They are now qualified to manage lower managerial functions, namely at customer service departments, or as shop managers, branch office directors, etc. The graduates of this course may if necessary also work as managers of specialized departments.

Vocational Practical Training

Vocational Practical training is a compulsory part of the study program. Students have to pass the programme in order to sit for a state exam. Students can undergo this training for 3 months in the final year of their studies. They may also undergo the training in parts spread over the entire course, in which case the total duration of the training must be at least 3 months.

Students may undergo the practical training in chosen specialized banking offices or other institutions under the supervision of the college. The aim of the vocational training is not only to acquire knowledge, which upgrades the study, but also to provide the students with contacts to managers, who are able to inform the undergraduates regarding specific new banking products, or about topical problems and their solutions.

Students who are employed in finance or other related areas may ask for recognition of their work as a practical training with a written request. They have to support their request with an employer's certificate describing their position and duties.
